

-3 x "Armide" class: Were building in France for foreign sale in 1914 (SD.2 for Japan, SD.3 & 4 for Greece); purchased by the French government & completed during the war; 4 x 18 in tubes ("Arm." had 6), 1 x 47 mm gun ("Arm." had 75 mm); Disp = 460/605 T, Lgth = 184 ft, Speed = 17.5/11 kt

-**Amazone** [SD.4] - Comm. 1917, served until 1932

-**Antigone** [SD.3] - Comm. 1917, served until 1935

-**Armide** [SD.2] - Comm. 1916, served until 1932

-**Roland Morillot** - Was the ex German coastal sub UB.26, which had been scuttled after damage off Le Havre in April 1916; refloated and joined French Navy in Aug 1917 as "R.M." (no number?); had 2 x 20 in tubes; Disp = 263/292 T, Lgth = 118 ft, Speed = 9.5/8 kt; in French service until 1925

-2 x "Delfin" class: Greek boats, seized by French in 12/16; in French Navy for 1917-18, then returned to Greece; had 5 x 18 in tubes; Disp = 310/460 T, Lgth = 164 ft, Speed = 13/8.5 kt; both had been comm. in 1912. Names: **Delfin, Xifias**

XIII. SEAPLANE CARRIERS

-**Foudre** - Originally a gunboat (1895), converted in 1913 to a carrier for 4 to 8 planes; also doubled as a submarine depot. Had 8 x 4 in, 4 x 9 pd and 2 x 3 pd guns; Disp = 6100 T, Lgth = 380 ft, Speed = 19 kt; scrapped 1921

The following were commercial vessels converted into seaplane carriers during the war:

-**Campinas** - 1896, a liner. Comm. 1915 as a carrier for 6 to 10 planes. Had no (?) guns; Disp = 3319 T, Lgth = 357 ft, Speed = 11.8 kt; served against Greece in 9/16; returned to civilian service in 1919

-**Nord** and **Pas de Calais** - Were sister ships, Channel packets dating from 1898. Comm. in the Navy in 1916, they carried ?? planes; Disp = 1541 T, Lgth = ??, Speed = 21 kt; both returned to their owner in 1919

-**Rouen** - 1912. Became a Navy carrier in 1917; # of planes unknown; Disp = 1656 T, Lgth = ??, Speed = 24 kt; returned to owner in 1919

XIV. SURVEY SHIPS

-2 x "Marche" class: Guns = 2 x 3 pd ("M" also had 1 x 9 pd); Disp = 1600 T, Lgth = ?? ft, Speed = 10 to 11 kt; both comm. in the 1890's; service termination date is unknown: **Marche, Vaucluse**
