

- 3 wooden 2nd-class screw frigates: 2198 T, 59 m, 9 kt; 6 x 60 pd, 40 x 30 pd, 4 x 24 pd guns; all three were stationed at Pola in 1859 and fought in 1866 at Lissa...
 - **Radetzky** - Comm. 1854; fought 1864 at Helgoland; sunk in an explosion 1869
 - **Adria** - Comm. 1857; was a gunnery training ship from 1868, scrapped 1888
 - **Donau** - Comm. 1857; scrapped 1872
- 2 wooden corvettes: 1697 T, 56 m, 9 kt; 16 x 30 pd, 4 x 60 pd, 1 x 48 pd guns...
 - **Erzherzog Friedrich** - Comm. 1858; was at Venice 1859; went to North Sea 1864 but arrived after the armistice (no actions); fought at Lissa 1866; scrapped 1899
 - **Dandolo** - Comm. in Feb 1859 and was at Venice during 1859 war; served Maximilian in Mexico 1865-67 (based at Vera Cruz); was a training ship from 1879; hulked 1881 as an accommodation ship; renamed *Schwarzenberg* in 1890; scrapped 1901
- **Feuerspeier** [ex *Venezia*] - Begun as a wooden frigate in 1858, but completed in 1860 as an armored floating battery of 16 x 48 pd guns to serve on the Venetian lagoons; was towed to Pola after the 1866 war, scrapped in 1870
- **Helgoland** - A sloop; 1798 T, 69 m, 10.5 kt; 2 x 7 in, 4 x 8 pd guns; comm. 1869, scrapped 1897
- **Fasana** - A sloop; 2382 T, 68 m, 11.5 kt; 2 x 21 cm, 4 x 8 pd guns; 1880 = 4 x 15 cm, 3 x 7 cm guns; comm. 1871; hulked 1896; in 1902 the hulk was renamed *Gamma*; as such was a mine depot hulk at Pola 1914-18; scrapped 1920
- 3 sloops: 1353 T, 59 m, 11 kt; 4 x 15 cm, 2 x 7 cm guns; in 1891 changed to 2 x 15 cm, 4 x 9 cm, 1 x 7 cm guns...
 - **Zrinyi** - Comm. 1871; hulked 1905; renamed 1908 as *Delta*; was a mine-depot hulk at Pola 1914-18, scrapped in 1920
 - **Aurora** - Comm. 1873; hulked 1902; was a mine-depot hulk at Sebenico 1914-18; to Yugoslavia 1920 as *Skradin* (scrapped 1927)
 - **Fruntsberg** - Comm. 1873; hulked 1902; was a mine-depot hulk at Sebenico 1914-18; to Yugoslavia 1920 as *Zlarin* (later *Krivosije* - sunk by English bombers in 1943)
- 2 frigates: 3394 T, 77 m, 13.7 kt; 15 x 15 cm, 2 x 7 cm guns...
 - **Radetzky** - Comm. 1873; became a gunnery training ship in 1897; hulked 1908 and renamed *Adria*; was an accommodation ship at Pola in 1914-18 (used by Reich-Germans from 1915); taken by Italy in 1919, scrapped 1921
