

- Poles - IR of 2 bns - # 1, 2, 3, 6, 8. Cav regts of 3 sqdns - ChR # 1, 5; UR # 2, 3, 6. Three foot batties (18 guns) and one horse batty (9 guns)
- Saxons - Ist Bn/IR Obschelwitz; Comb Gren Bn Einsiedel; the two gren comps of IR Rechtern (independent); two Hussar Sqdns; two batties (led by Kotsch, Semter), totaling 14 guns.

Action at Thann, 19 April 1809

Involved parts of Davout's III Corps; he used all of Div St Hilaire, and parts of his other divisions. There were 28,000 men and 36 guns; total casualties unknown.

- From Div Morand - IR 17 (3), Lt IR 13 (3); 12 guns
- From Div Friant - IR 33 (3), 48 (3); Lt IR 15 (3); 12 guns
- From Div Gudin - Lt IR 7 (3)
- Div St Hilaire (IR of 4 bns) - IR 3, 57, 72, 105; Lt IR 10; 12 guns
- From Cav Div Montbrun - HR 7 (4 sqdns).

Battle of Abensberg, 20 April 1809

Despite a wealth of source material, the order of battle for this battle remains obscure because of a lack of definition as to where the battlefield extended. The two sides were engaged over a large front in a number of actions, and there is no agreement as to which part of the front constituted "Abensberg." The best presentation is perhaps in the "West Point Atlas", which lists the following units (from left to right):

- III Corps - Cav Div Montbrun [reinforced], Div Friant, Div St Hilaire, one brigade from Cav Div St Sulpice
- Lannes' Provisional Corps - Div Morand [from III Corps], Div Gudin [from III], Cav Div Nansouty, Cav Div St Sulpice [minus a bde], Cav Bde Jacquinet [from III]
- VII Corps [reinforced] - Div Demont [attached from III Corps], Div Deroi, Div Crown Prince, Div Wrede
- VIII Corps - Apparently in its entirety (but placed under VII Corps HQ).

Battle of Eckmühl, 22 April 1809

This was the largest action of the April fighting. The battle honor "Eckmühl" was subsequently awarded to all units which took part in the campaign, regardless of whether they were actually engaged in this one battle. Thus individual unit histories may show a regiment as present when in fact it was fighting related actions nearby. The following depiction of units actually engaged is from Pivka. He shows Napoleon's strength as 53,000 men and 96 guns. Casualties were 3000 French, 400 Bavarians, and 50 Württembergers.

- Div St Hilaire [under Lannes' II Corps HQ] (IR of 3 bns) - IR 3, 57, 72, 105; Lt IR 10
- III Corps (IR of 3 bns)
