

-Graudenz Corps

This was the geographical title of a HQ which was better known as Zastrow's Corps (q.v.)

-Heiligblasen Group

A corps-level command existed in this sector of Alsace only in Sept-Oct 1918. Until Sept the sector of XV Reserve Corps had been known as the HQ "Weiler-Heiligblasen"; in Sept the northern portion became separate as the Heiligblasen Group; in early Nov the Heiligblasen area came under the control of LIX Corps (its neighbor on the north) and the separate command lapsed

-Karpathen Corps

The "Carpathian" title was borne by IV Reserve Corps while it supported the Austrians in the Carpathians, July 1916-Feb 1917

-Kneussl's Corps

Formed in April 1915 as a combined HQ over 119 ID and 11 Bavarian ID when they aided the Austrians in the Carpathians; the HQ was dissolved in July 1915

-Knoerzer's Corps

Formed in Feb 1918 for occupation service in Ukraine; it used the HQ of 7 LW Inf Div (and while the corps existed the units of 7 LW ID were attached to 20 LW ID); the corps HQ was dissolved in Oct 1918

-Kosch's Corps

Alternate designation of X Reserve Corps during the Battle of the Gnila Lipa in 1915

-Kovel Sector

(Also "Kowel"); this was the alternate designation of LV Corps from Dec 1916 to Feb 1918

-Landwehr Corps

Formed in Aug 1914 to command 3 and 4 Landwehr ID, the first units sent to support Austria on the East front; these two Divs (occasionally supplemented by others) stayed under the Corps for the entire war

COMMANDERS: Remus Woyrsch, Aug-Nov 1914; Gotz König, Nov 1914-Sept 1916 (he was technically acting for Woyrsch, who had been entrusted with higher commands); Gunther Kirchbach, Sept 1916-April 1917; Arthur Brietzke, April 1917-Nov 1918

BATTLES:

- 1914: Mobilized in the East - Tarnawka, Opatow, Ivangorod, Czentsochau
- 1915: Sienna, Pulwa, Slonim
- 1916: Became a HQ rather than a unit (though 3 & 4 LW ID were usually
