

Sultanhisar*** TORPEDO GUNBOATS ***

-Pelengi Deria (1890) - 3 x 75 mm and 4 x 47 mm guns; 3 x torpedo tubes (size unknown); 900 T, 229 ft, 19 kt; served until 1922

2 x boats - 2 x 4.1 in, 6 x 57 mm, 2 x 37 mm guns; 3 x 18 in tubes; 760 T, 262 ft, 21 kt (1906); both served until 1944 - **Berk i Satvet, Peyk i Sevket**

*** GUNBOATS ***

2 x boats - 4 x 4.7 in, 6 x 37 mm guns; 2 x 14 in tubes; 632 T, 190 ft, 12 kt (1894). **Kilid ul Bahir** was sunk as a block ship at Basra on 4 Aug 1914; **Zuhaf** was rearmed with 4 x 57 mm guns and used as a mine layer (through 1919)

3 x boats - 4 x 12 pd guns and 2 x MG; 198 T, 121 ft, about 12 kt (but there were some variations) (1894 to 1908). They served until around 1925: **Sevket Numa** (had been placed in reserve in 1909, but was again on active service from April 1915 to Oct 1918), **Nasr i Huda, Berika i Zafer**

Marmaris (1903) - 4 x 9 pd, 2 x 1 pd guns; 422 T, 172 ft, 14.8 kt. Stationed on Persian Gulf, and during the war moved up the Tigris River; sunk on the Tigris by UK gunboat Odin on 2 June 1915

Yozgat (1906) - 2 x 47 mm guns; 185 T, 131 ft, 12 kt; sunk by Russian DD off Kirpen Islands on 10 Dec 1915

3 x boats - 3 x 3 pd, 2 x 1 pd guns; 192 T, 154 ft, 12.4 kt (1907-08): **Nevsehir** was mined in the Bosphorus on 30 Jan 1915; **Taskopru** was sunk by Russian DD off Kirpen Islands on 10 Dec 1915; **Malatya** served until 1920

3 x boats - 3 x 75 mm and 2 x 3 pd guns; 413 T, 154 ft, 14 kt; all served until 1948 - **Isa Reis, Hizir Reis, Duruk Reis**

4 x boats - 2 x 100 mm and 2 x 47 mm guns; 502 T, 178 ft, 14 kt (1912): **Preveze, Sakiz** and **Burak Reis** served until 1924; **Aydin Reis** served until 1948

*** "SUBMARINES" ***

Abdul Hamid (1886) and **Abdul Medjid** (1887) were both non-operational; neither had been used since the 1880's; attempts to bring them back into service in 1914-18
